

## Credit & Grade Equivalence for Exchange Program with Kedge Business School

### Information from Kedge Business School (KBS)

#### 1. Credit Equivalence:

Kedge Business School : One course at KBS represents 30 contact hours and is worth 5 ECTS. Out of class (group work, assignments) learning hours: Depending on the course students might have oral presentations, group work, case studies. The exam depends also on the course and on the teachers. Some courses have final exams, other only continuous assessment, other a mix of both.

Note: The Programme Grande Ecole «Master in Management » is divided into 8 cycles of 4 weeks. For each cycle students will choose up to two courses that they wish to take during the cycle. Exams take place at the end of each cycle.

IMI, Delhi: 3 Credit course has 30 in class contact hours. The out of class learning hours have been defined as 60 hours for a 3 Credit Course.

Based on the information above the committee decided that the Credit equivalence for the courses undertaken at KBS by IMI students will be as follows:

1 Course of 5 ECTS at KBS = 1 Course of 3 Credits at IMI, Delhi

#### 2. Grade Equivalence:

##### Kedge Business School:

Kedge Business School has adhered to the letter grade of A to F with a percentage range of successful students as explained below.

#### Explanation of transcript

**Course code:** B = Bachelor courses - M = Master courses - LAN = Language courses  
E = Course taught in English - F = Course taught in French

**Duration of course unit:** S1 = first semester (fall semester)  
S2 = second semester (spring semester)

**Note:** 1 semester = 30 ECTS credits  
1 academic year = 60 ECTS credits

As per IMI's moderation system the number of students awarded an A+ or A grade should be kept within the range of 15% of the class size. More than 55% of the students fall within B+ and B- . The remaining 30-35% students fall in the C Grade category.

To give the benefit of range to the students the following grade conversion has been recommended by the committee.
